



SECTION V: BUSINESS AND TECHNOLOGY POLICY 5000

Computer Equipment/Mobile Broadband Devices

Insight School of Oklahoma (ISOK) will loan those students (at no cost) the necessary equipment to access the online learning platform for the duration of that student's enrollment in ISOK. Pursuant to the Agreement for Use of Instructional Property, families are solely liable for any loss or damage to the computer until it is returned to K12 and should take proper precautions to protect it. ISOK may require families to pay for lost or damaged computers. It should be noted there are no mandatory administrative, activity or ancillary fees or costs for attending ISOK.

ISOK also offers a mobile broadband device program to students who qualify. Qualification is defined as; economically disadvantaged, as determined by Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines used in determining eligibility for free and reduced-price meals and, or those in need of a mobile broadband device due to a change in life circumstances. Student who qualify may be eligible to be issued a mobile broadband device for the duration of enrollment at ISOK. The number of devices is limited and will be issued one per family on a first come, first served basis. The device is to be used for attending online classes, accessing and completing school work/activities and communicating with the school. It is not provided for personal use. The device is equipped with Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA) filters, but the school is not responsible for sites accessed through the device. By receiving the device, the legal guardian accepts responsibility for monitoring internet use of the student and responsibility for payment for lost, damaged or stolen devices. Normal use will not exceed the monthly allowable data. Misuse may cause the data to exceed limits, which results in loss of internet access until the next billing cycle. Misuse will result in denial to participate in ISOK's mobile broadband device program. The device must be returned immediately to ISOK upon withdrawal or graduation.

Without a waiver from the Head of the School, to be eligible for a mobile broadband device, a student must participate in all required testing and must have an attendance rate of no less than ninety percent (90%).
